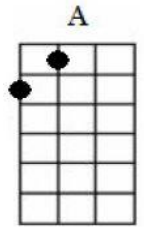
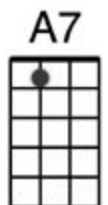

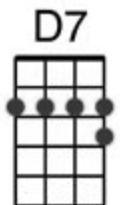
Way [A] down in Louisiana close to New Orleans

But he could [A] play guitar just like ringing a bell



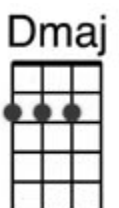

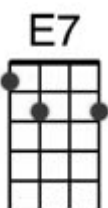
He [A] carried his guitar in a gunny sack
